
NYU SPS HIGHLIGHTS



Center for Publishing and Applied Liberal Arts Summer Publishing Institute students recently had an opportunity to **interview singer Jason Derulo** on his new book.

Stephanie Mattera, a professor within the Division of Programs in Business Department of Integrated Marketing & Communications, was recently **<u>quoted</u> <u>by Fortune</u>** on Disney CEO Bob Iger's comments on the Writers Guild of America and SAG-AFTRA strikes, and how deviating from a set communications plan can have repercussions. Iger's comments centered on the disruption the strikes are causing.

Amy Myers Jaffe of the Center for Global Affairs has <u>written a piece for The</u> <u>*Wall Street Journal*</u> on what is preventing the total electrification of energy. "Electrification is often the fastest and cheapest way to decarbonize our energy consumption. The technologies to decarbonize electricity already exist and are, for the most part, readily deployable at a large scale by the private sector. But here's a sobering fact about all the talk of the 'electrification of everything': It isn't likely to happen. At least, not soon."

The NYU Climate Change Initiative recently announced the recipients of the 2023 Climate Change Initiative awards, where 10 teams were selectively awarded \$125,000 to promote and conduct new research, activities, and innovations. CGA Associate Dean and Clinical Professor **Carolyn Kissane**, and CGA Research Faculty and Director of the NYU SPS ECJS Lab, **Amy Myers Jaffe**, <u>were featured as recipients of the "Understanding Energy</u> **Transitions" award**. Along with fellow faculty **Stephen Gross** (FAS History), **Andrezej Ancygler** (NYU Berlin), and **Maya Vinokour** (FAS Russian & Slavic Studies), they will assemble political science, sociology, economics, history, and cultural criticism experts to explore energy policies, historical energy shifts, political coalitions, and cultural contexts to accelerate the transition away from fossil fuels.


