

As a leading expert on human resources and the workplace experience, Anna Tavis, Division of Programs in Business Human Capital Management director was recently interviewed by several South American outlets, including Valor, the largest economic newspaper in Brazil, on an urgent and topical issue around the world workplace flexibility. In the May 23 article in Valor, Tavis argued that in the aftermath of the pandemic, learning to trust employees, regardless of whether they work from home, in the office, or from anywhere, should be the number one priority of leaders going forward. She believes that the hybrid model is what will succeed because, as much as leaders want to make decisions with old management fundamentals, "the train has already left the station and it will not return five days a week."
