
Dean's Remarks · May 27, 2022








Incoming NYU SPS Schack Larry & Klara Silverstein Chair in Real Estate Development and Investment, and Associate Dean Marc Norman Moderated a Panel at NYC's Housing Crisis Conference

Marc Norman, incoming NYU SPS Schack Institute of Real Estate Larry & Klara Silverstein Chair in Real Estate Development and Investment, and Associate Dean recently moderated a panel titled "The Future:

New Models of Development/New Approaches," at the NYC's Housing Crisis Conference, which took place on May 13 at the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Library. The Schack Institute was the academic partner for the Conference, which brought together leading housing experts, practitioners, researchers, journalists, policymakers, community activists, planners, and designers to discuss the causes, effects, and possible solutions to a newly emergent iteration of the ongoing housing crisis marked by sky-rocketing home prices, declining housing starts, record-setting homelessness, looming evictions, and a staggering affordability gap.



Recently NY1 featured a story about the collaboration between the **NYU School of Professional Studies Schack Institute of Real Estate, Taconic Partners,** and the **Fund for Public Housing** that have joined forces and have launched a pilot program, which provides a cohort of 20 **New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA)** high school students with an entry point to a commercial real estate career, while introducing them to college student life. 
