

Dean **Angie Kamath** spoke recently at the Leaders on Purpose CEO Summit on a panel titled "From Boardroom to Classroom: Aligning Corporate Strategy with Talent and Education for a more Just, Inclusive and Sustainable Tomorrow." The panel discussed pathways for young people, the need for reskilling agendas for existing workers, and how the Gen Z and Gen Alpha voices are so important.




